The Juvenile Crime Prevention Council (JCPC) has studied the risk factors and needs of Juvenile Court involved youth in this county and hereby publishes this Request for Proposals. The JCPC anticipates funds from the NC Dept. of Public Safety, Division of Administration, in the amount stated above to fund the program types specified below. Such programs will serve delinquent and at-risk youth for the state **fiscal year 2013-2014** beginning on, or after, **July 1, 2013**. The use of these funds in this county **requires a local match** in the amount specified above.

The JCPC will consider proposals for the following needed programs:

Temporary Shelter Care	Parent/Family Skill Building	
Restitution/Community Services	Interpersonal Skill Building	
Teen Court	Tutoring/Academic Enhancement Programs	Mentoring
Skill Building	Vocational Development	Sex Offender Evaluation/Treatment

Proposed program services should target the following risk factors for delinquency or repeat delinquency:

Youth under the age of 12 when first delinquent complaint, youth with 2-3 prior referrals to intake, runaway behaviors, substance abuse assessment and/or treatment needed, and youth rejected by pro-social peers and associate with others involved in delinquent/criminal activities.

Programs should address the following concerns as reported in the Needs Assessments for adjudicated youth:

Peer Domain: Youth involved in Stanly County Juvenile Court has seen an increase in youth that associate with others who have been involved in delinquent/criminal activity.

Individual Domain: Youth involved in Juvenile Court has seen an increase of physical, sexual, or emotional abuse or neglect or criminal victimization.

Family Domain: Parents and/or family members involved in the criminal justice system, lack of parenting skills, and homes that experience increased marital and domestic discord.

School Domain: Serious school problems that tend to lead to an increase in school suspensions and unexcused absences.

Applicants are being sought that are able to address items below:

1. Program services compatible with research that are shown to be effective with juvenile offenders.
2. Program services are outcome-based.
3. The program has an evaluation component.
4. Program services that decrease delinquent behavior, gang participation or divert individuals from gang participation.

Local public agencies, 501(c)(3) non-profit corporations and local housing authorities are invited to submit applications to provide services addressing the above elements.
