The Juvenile Crime Prevention Council (JCPC) has studied the risk factors and needs of Juvenile Court involved youth in this county and hereby publishes this Request for Proposals. The JCPC anticipates funds from the NC Dept. of Public Safety in the amount stated above to fund the program types specified below. Such programs will serve delinquent and at-risk youth for the state **fiscal year 2015-2016** beginning on, or after, **July 1, 2015**. The use of these funds in this county **requires a local match** in the amount specified above.

The JCPC will consider proposals for the following needed programs:

Sex Offender Evaluation & Treatment	Teen Court	Tutoring/Academic Enhancement
Temporary Shelter Care	Experiential Skill Building	Vocational Development
Mediation/Conflict Resolution	Parent/Family Skill Building	Mentoring
Restitution/Community Service	Interpersonal Skill Building	

Proposed program services should target the following risk factors for delinquency or repeat delinquency:

*Moderate and Serious School Behaviors *Parent/Guardian/Custodian Supervision Skills
*Youth association with others involved in delinquent/criminal activity *Runaway behaviors
*Stanly County has seen an increase in juveniles under the age of 12 involved in juvenile court.

Programs should address the following concerns as reported in the Needs Assessments for adjudicated youth:

Peer Domain: Juveniles who associate with other delinquent youth, who are gang members or associate with gang members.

Individual Domain: Substance abuse or use, history of physical, sexual, or emotional abuse or neglect, and youth with mental health needs.

Family Domain: Parental support and/or parental enhancement skills needed for juvenile court referred youth.

School Domain: Youth involved with Stanly County Juvenile Justice System have increased risk of school behavior issues reflected in long-term suspensions and truancy issues.

Applicants are being sought that are able to address items below:

1. Program services compatible with research that are shown to be effective with juvenile offenders.
2. Program services are outcome-based.
3. The program has an evaluation component.
4. Program services detect gang participation and divert individuals from gang participation.

Local public agencies, 501(c)(3) non-profit corporations and local housing authorities are invited to submit applications to provide services addressing the above elements.
