The Juvenile Crime Prevention Council (JCPC) has studied the risk factors and needs of Juvenile Court involved youth in this county and hereby publishes this Request for Proposals. The JCPC anticipates funds from the NC Dept. of Public Safety in the amount stated above to fund the program types specified below. Such programs will serve delinquent and at-risk youth for the state fiscal year **2021-2022** beginning on, or after, **July 1, 2021**. The use of these funds in this county **requires a local match** in the amount specified above.

**The Juvenile Crime Prevention Council may recommend certain programs for one or two-year funding awards dependent upon program performance, compliance with JCPC policy, and the availability of state JCPC allocation funds.*

The JCPC will consider proposals for the following needed programs:

*Restitution/Community Service	*Home Based Counseling	
*Interpersonal Skill Building	*Problem Sexual Evaluation/Treatment	*Parent/Family Skill Building
*Tutoring/Academic Enhancement	*Experiential Skill Building	*Teen Court
*Individual/Group Counseling	*Vocational Development	*Mediation/Conflict Resolution
*Family Counseling	*Mentoring	

Proposed program services should target the following risk factors for delinquency or repeat delinquency:

1. Juveniles who associate with other delinquent youth;
2. School Behavior Problems
3. Parents/Guardians who have difficulty providing adequate supervision;
4. Reduction in Juvenile Recidivism.

Programs should address the following concerns as reported in the Needs Assessments for adjudicated youth:

Peer Domain: Juveniles who are rejected by pro-social peers and associate with others involved in delinquent/criminal activity.

Individual Domain: Mental health services are critical issues in providing assistance to youth and families involved in the juvenile justice system. Programs receiving funds shall provide appropriate access to these services.

Family Domain: Parental Support and/or parental enhancement skills needed for court referred youth. Access services that provide best practices and have the ability to engage families are needed.

School Domain: Youth involved with Stanly Juvenile Court have an increased risk of school behavior issues reflected in prolonged absences and suspensions.

Applicants are being sought that are able to address items below:

1. Program services compatible with research that are shown to be effective with juvenile offenders.
2. Program services are outcome-based.
3. The program has an evaluation component.
4. Program services detect gang participation and divert individuals from gang participation.

Local public agencies, 501(c)(3) non-profit corporations and local housing authorities are invited to submit applications to provide services addressing the above elements.
